Pupil Conferencing

In September we implemented our Golden Rules and the new behaviour system. In addition we introduced a new regime for children to follow at the end of break.

This week, as part of our monitoring, Mrs Scarborough and I have interviewed eight children in KS2 to find out what they think about current behaviour at St Mary's.

The feedback that they provided was very positive—here are some quotes:

"We are learning much faster now."

"People aren't running down the corridors... it's much calmer."

"We are learning a lot more and it's much better. Lots of people are realising that they are working hard for themselves... my friends and adults are saying well done."

"Behaviour is a million times better. People now understand that SATs are here and we have to learn. If you came into our class now you would see good behaviour and we would be working hard."

This week, Year 5 chose to host a Greek banquet during their Golden Time. The class and their families worked hard at creating a feast and the event proved to be very popular and successful!


We would like to pass on our thanks to all of you at home who supported this event—it was very much appreciated. The children had a wonderful time, but also learnt a great deal about food in Greek times.
