I am writing this ahead of time as, much to the surprise of the children, even Headteachers need to keep learning! I will be on a Headteachers' Conference with all my CAST colleagues looking at the latest developments in education.

It is great to be settled back into life at St Mary's and I am absolutely overwhelmed with the generosity and 'pulling together' of the school community. Our Macmillan coffee morning was a huge success and due to the amount of cakes we received, we were even able to sell cakes to the children after school. In total we raised £188 for this extremely worthwhile cause. Congratulations also to our winner of the 'Spot the Cake' competition, Judith Mooney who received £21.

As a school we have redesigned our behaviour policy to ensure that every child is given the opportunity to reach their full potential in an environment that supports their learning. The children, governors and school staff have chosen 5 core values to form the foundation of our school expectations. The school swimming pool has been looked at earlier this week by an engineer and the filtration system will be tested. As soon as we know that the pool is ready to be used we can start looking at companies to hire it which will in turn ensure the pool is cost affective. As a school we also need to consider the cost of employing extra staff to take the lessons and maintain the pool. I am sure you will appreciate that we do not want to open it in haste and have to close it again and I really appreciate your support and patience in this matter.
